Location



All parking lots are completely secured with gates and lighting.








THE BROCK CENTER'S PAST THE STATE'S GREATEST SPORTS RIVALRY BEGAN HERE

The Brock Center stands on the site of the playing field of the very first "IRON BOWL".

The rivalry was born on February 22nd 1893 when The University of Alabama played against Alabama Polytechnic (later, Auburn University) in Lakeview Park which is now home to the Brock Center.





Auburn won that day, 32–22. Though taking to the field 88 times since then, Alabama leads the series 51–37–1.
