#7 Time Limit for Removal from Zone - Except in the case of articles for use in a zone (see Section 2.6 FTZM), merchandise for which a CBP permit for transfer to the Customs territory has been issued must be physically removed from the zone within 5 working days of issuance of that permit. The Port Director, upon request of the Operator, may extend that period for good cause. Merchandise awaiting removal within the required time limit will not be further manipulated or manufactured in the zone, but will be segregated or otherwise identified by the Operator as merchandise that has been constructively transferred to the Customs territory. (19 CFR 146.71(c)).
